## Old Hall Marshes - News and General Instructions

## News

Record how long it takes you to get all 25 caches from leaving and arriving back at the start car park, and note the time on the log for the Bonus' Bonus. The record so far is 4 hours 33 minutes by "We do checks and cache".

## Conditions of Use:

- Take clothing and sun protection appropriate to the weather and time of year
- Wear boots or similar stout footwear, and take care when walking over soft, rough or uneven ground
- Keep to the footpaths and observe hazard warning signs
- Keep clear of steep banks, open water, sluices and dams
- The intertidal zone is a hazardous area - do not leave the safety of the sea wall for this area
- To reduce disturbance to wildlife and livestock, please keep dogs under close control


## Cache Types

There are two types of caches: micros and clip boxes.
All the micros are traditional caches i.e. the co-ordinates are given. Other than Prequel 1, the micros are camouflaged cylinders. They are fixed in place with a ring. Do not remove the micro, simply unscrew the lower part to reveal the log roll. After signing carefully insert the log, replace the tube and re-screw firmly.

All the clip boxes are in camouflage bags and their locations are determined from multiple code letter/number combinations i.e multi-caches (although for the convenience of publication these are shown as puzzle caches). UPPERCASE code letters and their corresponding single-digit numbers are found at signage on Old Hall Marshes; lowercase code letters and their corresponding two-digit numbers will be found written on the cache logs in red. Multicache co-ordinates can be calculated from UPPERCASE or lowercase letters.

All caches are placed on or within 10 metres of defined paths.
The route map only shows the approximate area of the caches.
